

#### Some of the happenings within the District:

Diabetic Retinopathy is a partnership between the Lions of Michigan Foundation and District 11 A1 and District 11 A2 Lions Clubs, and a group of eye care professionals and research scientists who are collecting and analyzing data for Henry Ford Health System

Members of 11 A1 assisted in securing a \$40,000 grant for Mobile Retinopathy

Screening.

By taking the process to the community, we can help to detect ocular disorders before it is too late.

### The process only takes 4 minutes.

A QR code was created by Lion Daniel Rathbun to assist the input of information for new recruits. This card will speed up the process of collecting information and allow a faster response. Information such as: the club's name, who referred them, individual's interest, type of information wanted, application, and other pertinent information required can be obtained.

The District has an ongoing project of donating gift cards to Ronald McDonald. We held our 4th successful Community Giveaway and Recycle. Over 200 people attended to receive furniture, household goods, and clothing.

# No club is too small if the members are determined to achieve. Small clubs can initiate small projects and enjoy successes. Olawale Afolabi (FB) says there are three Cs in life:

#### You must make a CHOICE to take a CHANCE, or your life will never CHANGE.

The State and District projects were invited to attend our 2nd Cabinet Meeting. This was an opportunity for new members to learn more about the projects, their purpose, and causes. The following agencies attended or were represented: Beaumont Silent Children, Lions of Michigan, Greater Agency for the Blind and Visually Impaired, Leader Dog for the Blind, Bear Lake, and Michigan All State Bank. The projects brought agency literature and souvenirs to distribute.

We conducted Officer Training classes at Madonna University for incoming Lions to prepare them for their new positions. Follow-up training classes were provided for those unable to attend the first class. The training for the Region and Zone Chairs was held at the Renaissance Club House. Individual or follow-up training will be available when needed.

The first Governor Advisory Committee Meeting was held with the emphasis on Service. A second meeting for Membership and Leadership will be held in the 3rd quarter of next year. The IT Chair developed submission deadlines for photos and flyers to be published in the monthly newsletter and for upcoming events to be sent out to clubs through monthly



Mailchimp. These deadlines will reduce the volume of emails received and ensure timely delivery of valuable information.

The Governor held a Zoom meeting with all the presidents to ask for ideas, suggestions, and concerns. This will be done quarterly.

District nominees for the Hall of Fame were PDGs Ron Coleman and Titus McCleary posthumously). Selection will be done at the MD Convention on May 16, 2024.

### HOW CAN WE IMPROVE OUR DISTRICT?

Three major goals we are working towards:

- to increase our District to 800 members.
- To achieve positive net growth.
- To charter at least one (1) club.

During the last 5 and half months, we added 94 members. However, we dropped 210.

We had a net growth of (-27) at the end of November.

There are many different tools available to assist in improving our clubs' performance. Thinking Positive – glass half full vs half empty. Thinking out the box; trying new methods to achieve our goals. Some of the areas to be examined are:

- New Club Development Workshop
- Districtwide Membership Drive
- Development of a QR card exit interview survey.


The Lions Club international has moved furniture into Twelve homes over the past month just in time before the holidays, and if you could've seen the faces and the comments of those who said





From July through November of this year, our Michigan Lions Foundation has provided services and financial support to District 10 and Multiple District 11 Lions Clubs amounting to:

PROJECT KIDSIGHT – 15,840 screened and 1,732 children referred for follow-up eye care.

HEARING SCREENING – 170 children and 80 adults have been screened and 19 referred for follow-up care. DIABETIC RETINOPATHY SCREENING – 112 screened and 13 referred for follow-up care.

EMERGENCY INDIVIDUAL ASSISTANCE & DISASTER RELIEF – 18 grants totaling over \$32,000 to help people in 9 of 11 Lions of Michigan Districts.

EYE CARE ASSISTANCE – 38 adults and 18 children have received assistance

HEARING AID ASSISTANCE - 70 adults and 1 child have been provided hearing aids

We are totally dedicated to help Lions Clubs provide assistance to those in need in their communities. Our

largest fundraiser is our Annual Sight and Hearing Sweepstakes, and this statewide raffle provides a great opportunity for your club to also raise money for your local projects. Raffle tickets sell for \$10 each, and participating Lions Clubs receive a portion of the proceeds from the sale of tickets in accordance to the following schedule:

30 to 99 tickets sold - Lions Club receives \$3.50 per ticket

100 to 249 tickets sold – Lions Club receives \$5.00 per tickets 250+ tickets sold – Lions Club receives \$5.50 per ticket

In addition, the Lions Club or person who sells the ticket becomes eligible for a drawing on May 4, 2024 at the

Lions of Michigan State Office with prizes of \$1,000, \$500, \$250 and \$100.

The Grand Prize of the raffle is \$5,000. Subsequent tickets that are randomly selected receive prizes of \$2,500,

\$2,000, \$1,500, \$1,000, \$500, \$400, \$300, \$200 and \$100. The drawing will take place on May 18, 2024 during the MD11 Convention that will be held at the Sheraton by Marriott in Grand Rapids, MI.

Our students usually depart the U.S. the last weekend of June or beginning of July for a 3 to 5 week stay depending on the Youth Exchange program in those countries. Please note that all counties are on a first come basis and fill up fast so the sooner you apply the sooner we can confirm your acceptance.

### Selection of a Lions Young Adult Ambassador

The appropriate selection of a young adult to represent a Lions Club, community, state, and America is of paramount importance. The choice should be a young adult who, it is believed, will make a good "ambassador" both in words and actions. Both areas of character are a reflection of the USA and are of equal importance. Academics are a factor in the selection process, but other areas of a person's character also demonstrate qualities of strength that make a good ambassador. These could be sports, music, leadership, technology, and the like. A young person with good character is what the Lions seek. A request to travel has never been denied if a young adult has interest. Young adult ambassadors that have not traveled with YCE previously will fill the slots for a country before a young adult ambassador that has traveled with YCE.

Lions believe that every opportunity should be extended to a young adult to expand his/her knowledge, international understanding, and education in cultural diversity. People of the world need to appreciate and understand one another. This can be done through exposure to the culture, through an immersion in the life of a family. As the world becomes smaller through technology, it is imperative that young adults have the opportunity to experience

international cultural diversity in order to nurture an improved relationship with America's international neighbors. We do this with the International Lions Youth Exchange Program!

# <u>Time Line</u>

September/October/November: District Chairs and committee members promote the program, focusing on and making personal contact with LEO Clubs and/or high schools in their District. Upon a young adult's commitment, the District Chairperson sends the initial application to the State Chairperson, Lion Elvie Marfil. A formal recognition of the young adult's acceptance into the Lions Club Youth Exchange Program will be sent from the state chairperson to both the District Chairperson and the young adult.

December 15 or before: The signed Application, Indemnity Form, and Compulsory Items must be

received by State Chairperson Lion Elvie Marfil, epmarfil5@gmail.com. Some exceptions may apply with permission however, it must go through the District Chair to the State Chair. Signatures are needed at each level.

### Upon Commitment until March 30 the LYE (Lions Youth Exchange) young adult's

### responsibilities include:

• Contact clubs via a phone call, letter or email correspondence to obtain donations for travel

expenses. Make arrangements to meet with the club personally. A list of clubs and pertinent information is furnished by the District Chairperson. Many clubs will not donate unless there is

face- to- face contact. The clubs want to know why this experience is important to the LYE young adult.

• Contact family and friends to solicit funds for travel expenses.

- Create, schedule, and execute fundraisers to raise money for the LYE experience.
- Attend the Fall District/Regional Lions Conference (usually in October) to make the LYE visible to the clubs. The clubs want to know why this experience is important to the LYE young adult.
- Obtain a passport and/or visa.

**March 30:** All funds should be gathered for travel expenses and submitted to State Chairperson Lion Elvie Marfil. February 28 is the deadline for all trip donations from the clubs.

March/April/May/June: Host families are found and flight tickets are purchased. Contact between the

host country and the state LYE chairperson is not always immediate. Flight tickets cannot be purchased until a host family is found. Please stick closely to this timeline.

May: Youth and family must attend a mandatory meeting in Lansing for LYE parents/guardians, district LYE

chairperson, and/or committee member. The LYE young adult will receive a backpack, shirts, pins, banners, flight tickets, insurance information, and general information about airports, security, filling out immigration forms, etc.

### IMPORTANT: Any young adult not making the timeline as listed above will be dropped from that year's program, unless cleared by the District Chair and State Chair. This is a very time- consuming process for all involved, and it requires all involved to closely follow the deadlines. Thank for your involvement

# Suggestions for LYE Fundraising

Create a display board, short 5-10 minute video, PowerPoint, or oral presentation about yourself and your desire to travel abroad. This can also be used when visiting a foreign country's Lions Club during your stay overseas.

Include these points and others as seen fit for your presentation:

- Name and family members
- Where you live
- Your involvement in sports, clubs, music, activities
- Other involvement, whether academic or community- based
- Places you have visited in the past

• Why do you want to visit another country? What will you take from the experience? As an Ambassador for the American Lions Clubs and America, how will you relate to the people of a foreign country? Will you be open to new experiences? Will you taste new foods? Will you practice your foreign language skills?

1. Contact clubs via a phone call, letter, or email correspondence to obtain donations for travel

expenses. A copy of the PowerPoint or video could be sent to the clubs in lieu of a formal visit when letting the club know of the intent to travel with LYEP.

#### 2. VERY IMPORTANT: Make arrangements to meet with the club personally. A list of clubs and

pertinent information is furnished by the District Chairperson. Many clubs will not donate unless there is face- to- face contact. The clubs want to know why this experience is important to the LYE young adult. Present your short program to the clubs. They understand that you may be nervous. If timing or distance from a meeting is a problem, send your PowerPoint or a DVD of your video for them to present at a meeting. Follow up with a phone call to be certain that it was received; ask if there are any questions. Write a thank- you note for viewing your presentation at their meeting shortly after the meeting date. Do not wait for any funds to arrive; the clubs look for effort and gratitude.

3. Contact friends and family members. Email and/or Facebook are a good way to get the word out

to distant family members. Send your PowerPoint or Video presentation. This demonstrates that you have exerted some effort in exchange for their monetary donation. It demonstrates responsibility and adult behavior.

4. Contact your church (if applicable) and ask to have a bake sale or car wash after Sunday Service.

5. Conduct a community car wash or bake sale. This could occur at a community function, library, or outside a local business.

6. Run, walk, or bike ride in an event. Gather pledges before the event occurs.
