PU101's are now due - Make sure you have selected your Club Officers (President / Secretary / Treasurer / Membership Chair) and submit their names to LCl by May 15th. Timely submission helps incoming District Leadership to prepare for the next fiscal year too.

Membership Dues for FY2023/24 - Every Club's goal should be to make sure your Club Roster is finalized before the start of the new fiscal year (July 1st, 2023). Here are 3 milestones to guide your efforts.

May 15th, 2023: Invoice your members for FY2023/24 dues, due 6-15-23

June 15th, 2023: Follow up with any member who has not confirmed for FY2023/24 by 6-25-23.

June 25th, 2023: Finalize your starting Club Roster for FY 2023/24 and submit to LCI.

By following this approach, all Clubs will have collected their member's dues in advance and will pay their International, State and Local dues on time.

Thought you might like to know that....

In April, Sixteen Freedom House Detroit residents applied for and received a VSP certificate good for one free Eye Exam and pair of Glasses. Residents of Freedom House are refugees or are seeking asylum in the United States. District 11A1 worked with the Lions of Michigan Foundation to get the applications processed and approved.

UEG Best Practices Meeting attended by representatives of the Grand Rapids Lions (PID Gary Anderson), His Healing Touch Ministries (Dr. Jeff Chapman) and MOST Ministries (Kelly Bone) on March 24th. Attendees identified nine Best Practices that will be helpful to all three organizations, including recommendations on equipment, transporting of UEGs, sharing of volunteers, sharing of UEGs collected, publishing a combined schedule of Vision Missions, co-sponsoring larger Vision Missions, etc. Additional follow up Zoom meetings are now being planned

"How Long have you been a Lion and who or what inspired you to become a Lion?"

"When I was a child, the Lions sponsored several Christmas parties, and one of my fondest memories was meeting Al Kaline.

I first became a Lion in the 1990's to help promote the E-Blind program, that offered computer training for the blind. I later rejoined a Dearborn club and am now president of the Harper Woods Grosse Pointe Woods club.

The LIONS were there for me as a blind child, so it's my turn to give back!"

"What does being a Lion mean to you?"

"It really is all about service and giving back! I've had 9 Leader dogs so that passion drives me to promote their programs, and ask others to give. I love technology, and that led to our work on recycling technology for all to use!

I have a Masters in Social Work and worked in Rehab medicine, and advocated for assistive technology, and now as a Lion I chair two District Committees; Leader Dog, to help increase knowledge of their programs for guide dogs, cane travel and camp, and the Blind low vision activity committee."

"What activities does/did your club focus on?"

"Our long running Good Fellows project, and Most recently, our local food bank, and running a recycling program to provide free used items to increase independence for people who are Blind or have low vision."

"Tell us something about yourself that would surprise people?"

"I was painfully shy growing up! Amazing how things can change!

For fun, I travel, including trips to Tanzania, Hawaii, I go to ball games, concerts and love to curl up with a good Braille Book!"

Lion Cathy McAdam is 76 years young and was widowed in 1993 with no children.

She is now in a wonderful long-term relationship with Michael who helps keep her young!




