As we look around our communities, we try to determine what actions are necessary to improve the quality of life of the residents. We become aware of the things wrong or nonexistence within the community. We gather information, increase our knowledge base, and skill set. We seek partnerships to strengthen our position. When you multiply these, times 1.4 million people, the global effect is astronomical.

District 11 A1 has risen to the challenge of providing service. In June we had a successful Community Day. The purpose of this event was: 1.) to inform and alert the deaf, blind, and low vision of all the services and agencies available to them, and 2.) to let the general public know the challenges and successes of these communities. In addition, there were several vendors like: Leader Dog, EyeLearn, educational and sign language book entrepreneurs, who were available to explain their services and the benefits offered to these communities.

To continue this path of service in the fiscal year 2023-2024, we held our 4th successful Community Giveaway and Recycle Event in July. Over 200 people attended to receive furniture (couches, tv, mattresses beds, tables, household items) and clothes. In addition, we provide free screening for KidSight and adult Diabetic Retinopathy and received our first referral for possible Retinopathy.

As we continue to demonstrate the 'We Serve' motto through our actions of service, we must publicize the good works of the Lions clubs through our social media platforms, print, and word of mouth avenues. Most importantly, we need to record our activities on LCI/MyLion to spread awareness of all the wonderful services being provided.

MESSAGE FROM IPDG MATT COLLINS

As of July 1st, my year as District Governor has come to a close. I would like to thank every member of District 11A1 for your support of both our District and our Clubs during the past fiscal year. I would especially like to thank our District Leadership Team, our Voting Cabinet and all of the Lions volunteers who served the District in any capacity during the past 12 months. Thank you for helping the District have a very successful fiscal year.

Please join me in welcoming Lion Lula Gardfrey as your District Governor for FY2023/24. Thank you in advance for providing District Governor Lula with the support needed to help her and the District to have another very successful year.

District Highlights from FY2022/23

Putting the Pandemic behind us, we were once again able to make in-person visits to our Clubs. These visits were enlightening, showing a strong resurgence in support of Lionism and community service activity throughout the District and helping us to better understand the needs of our Clubs and our membership going forward. To help our Clubs, we sponsored multiple Membership Workshops to give our Clubs the proven member recruitment tools needed to welcome new Lions. We then held two "Meet the Lions" Membership Recruitment Events to help our Clubs attract new members to Lionism. To help our Clubs, we organized a number of District-wide Service Projects. We donates lots of household items to families in need (Donation Giveaway, August, 2022), we helped fund and built 50 beds for delivery to children who didn't have a bed to sleep in (Sleep in Heavenly Peace, Sept 2022), we purchased, packed and distributed 25000 meals to the hungry in District 11 A1 (Kids Coalition Against Hunger, June, 2023 at WC3) and we held our first Communication Conference for the Visually and Hearing Impaired (June 2023 @ WcC3) Our Clubs and our Members were very generous in their support and participation, with many first time volunteers attending these Events.

I am pleased to report that during the past fiscal year District 11A1 applied for and just received a \$20,000 Grant from LCIF to help cover costs associated with a Diabetic Retinopathy Screening Project. I am also pleased to report that we established a partnership with Wayne County Community College that has the potential to help expand the reach of Lionism within the District for years to come. Over the past six months, we were able to hold four District Events on WC3 properties and we were well received by WC3 staff on each occasion. There is good potential to strengthen this partnership and increase our access to WC3 students in the coming years.

Our Quarterly District Cabinet Meetings were designed to be fun, time efficient and cost effective and along with conducting the business of the District each featuring an Agenda filled with valuable information for our attendees. For the first time in more than 30 years we held our District Convention in Downtown Detroit. Our Convention featured some Friday Night Fun and Fellowship Events (Tigers Game, Jazz Club Show) followed by Saturday's half-day Convention held at WC3 Downtown. Designed to be fun, time efficient and cost effective, Saturday's Convention featured our Memorial Service to fallen Lions, plenty of educational breakout sessions, our annual elections, a delicious luncheon, Member Awards and Keynote Speaker, PID Justin Faber who also inducted four new Lions. The structure of this District Convention was unique in many respects and in my view a welcome change from past District Conventions. I encourage future District Governors to conduct their District Conventions in a similar structure and do so within the District so more of our members are able to attend and participate.

Lastly, there is a tradition of having a District Governor Appreciation Dinner after the end of each fiscal year. These events are both time-consuming and costly to all concerned, so we will not have a District Governor Appreciation Dinner this year. Instead, take the time and money that you just saved and pay it forward within your communities. This is where the emphasis needs to be... increasing Lions Club support to each and every community that "We Serve."





LEADER DOGS JULY -AUGUST

Leader Dog added a new program called Youth Orientation & Mobility. We successfully piloted this program option last year. Youth O&M will provide Orientation and Mobility (white cane) instruction for 16-or 17-year-olds. Additionally, the program provides education for an adult supporter (such as a family member) to learn more about blindness, the skills their loved one uses, and how to help with O&M goals.

Participants in this program stay in a local hotel and participate in our traditional training environments. All travel, meals, and hotel expenses are covered by Leader Dog. This program is one week and is scheduled based on the availability of the participants. Within our Guide Dog Program, we have expanded our DeafBlind program* to include adaptive services. The Leader Dog DeafBlind and Adaptive Services training program offers individualized service models for people with vision loss and additional needs. Our team specializes in direct instruction using spoken English or American Sign Language with individuals who are DeafBlind, have mobility issues, and/or have cognitive impairments. Our team emphasizes the individual and focuses on adapting instructional techniques to meet the specific needs of each student.

Examples of clients who will be served in the Leader Dog DeafBlind and Adaptive Services training include clients with vision loss and cerebral palsy, clients who are on the Autism Spectrum, clients who have a learning disability and struggle with group instruction, clients who have a traumatic brain injury and struggle with memory and cognition, clients who are totally deaf and totally blind and uses tactile American Sign Language, clients who have balance difficulties.

We will continue to give away recycled equipment to people who are blind or have low vision. We continue to work with the local libraries for the blind who donate used equipment. The word has spread and we also get donations from individuals, contacts with LIONS and the VA. Our most popular items are hand held magnifiers, video magnifiers and closed circuit TV's.

We will also continue to address accessibility concerns for web development and handouts.


