MESSAGE FROM DISTRICT 11 A1 - DISTRICT GOVENOR, LULA GARDFREY

Dear Lions,

Change is never easy, but to achieve your goals it may be necessary. My question to you is: Can we improve our District without Change?

It is said that you cannot continue to do the same thing, the same way and expect a different result. (author unknown). Ian Percy's book, "Commandment for an Enthusiastic Team", published 2003, is still true today. It takes teamwork, it takes enthusiastic members.

If you agree that change is a given to elevate our performance, then you may agree with Kevin Brimhall of JDF Solutions. His analysis of the commandments gives you food for thought.

Let's look at the commandments and the analysis. Can you see how changing your perspective leads to a more positive solution to help turn our district around?

Commandment #1: Help each other be right – not wrong.

Analysis: What is the big picture? Think about what is important, and what you are trying to accomplish.

Commandment #2: Look for ways to make ideas work – not reasons they will not.

Analysis: Too often, we have the mindset of "We've tried that before", or "We don't do things that way". Instead, try: "What if we try it again?" What if we look at it differently." "What would we do to make this work if it was our only option?"

Commandment #3: If in doubt – check it out! Do not make negative assumptions about each other. **Analysis**: Lean into the challenge or obstacle, rather than assuming that it cannot be overcome. Do a little more research.

Commandment #4: Help each other win and take pride in each other's victories.

Analysis: One sign of a mature and effective team is when the team members get as much pride and satisfaction from the accomplishments of others as they do from their own.

Commandment #5: Speak positively about each other and about the organization at every opportunity.

Analysis: No one likes a Negative Nelly or Davey Downer. Do not ignore issues and shortcomings but speak well of others, and they will do the same of you.

Commandment #6: Maintain a positive mental attitude no matter what the circumstances. **Analysis**: Positive feeds on itself, but so does negativity. Your attitude influences how you act and how you respond to situations. So, keep a positive, can-do attitude.



Commandment #7: Act with initiative and courage as if it all depends on you.

Analysis: You do not have to be out in front all the time, but if team members consistently wait for others to act first, then no one will take the lead and forward momentum is hampered. Every team member should view the success of the project or initiative as their responsibility and take the initiative accordingly.

Commandment #8: Do everything with enthusiasm – It is contagious.

Analysis: Ask yourself: Do you want to help energize the team, or drag it down? Teammates should be able to rely on one another when working together.

Commandment #9: Whatever you want – give it away.

Analysis: Persistence and perseverance make the difference in whether the team is successful or not; so, find reasons to keep your confidence high and your belief strong, and help your teammates do the same.

Commandment #10: Do not lose faith – never give up.

Analysis: Do not expect more of others than you are willing to give of yourself. Give of yourself to your teammates...without the expectation of getting anything in return.

Commandment #11: Have Fun!

Analysis: Sometimes, the last thing we think about having at work is fun. But work should be fun, enjoyable, energizing, and fulfilling. Does that sound like "work"? When team members have fun together, they work harder, stay committed to achieving the goals longer, take care of the team better, and handle difficult situations with more composure and empathy.

So, go ahead – Have some Fun.

There are many different tools on LCI's webpage to assist us in improving the overall performance of the District. Thinking positive – glass half full vs half empty, thinking outside the box or trying new methods are several methods we can use. So let us keep our eyes on the prize.

Let us embrace CHANGE! Let us achieve our Membership goal of 800 members by June 20, 2024!!

SEPTEMBER IS HUNGER AWARENESS MONTH

Hunger can affect people from all walks of life. Millions of people in America are just one job loss, missed paycheck, or medical emergency away from hunger. But hunger doesn't affect everyone equally – some groups like children, seniors, Black, indigenous, and other people of color face hunger at much higher rates. And if you think you aren't affected, Hunger is closer than you think. Your neighbor, your child's classmate, or even your coworker may be struggling to get enough to eat.

In our District, 11-A1, 19.5% (344,400) of Wayne County Residents and 10.5% (15,740) of Monroe County residents face Food Insecurity.

How can you help?

•Conduct a community "Needs Assessment". This gives you an ideal of what are the hunger needs in your specific area

·Contact your local health department to learn which populations are greatest at risk, i.e., seniors, youth, minorities

·Identify organizations which are already mobilized around hunger and find out where the gaps are in services provided, and ask how can you/your club support these organizations.

·Work with the District GST to implement hunger service activities

And make sure to report your activity in "MyLCI".

CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

Childhood cancer is the leading cause of death by disease for children in the U.S. September is Childhood Cancer Awareness Month, a time to support and advocate for children and families affected by this disease.

Childhood cancer is associated with a range of warning symptoms, such as fever, severe and persistent headaches, bone pain and weight loss, that can be detected by families and trained health-care providers. When identified early, cancer is more likely to respond to effective treatment and result in a greater probability of survival, less suffering and less expensive treatment. Ongoing care is required to monitor cancer recurrence and to manage any possible long-term impact of treatment.

The support we provide as Lions for the children and their families should be maintained due to the frequent doctor visits. The organizations supported by the Childhood Cancer Committee are Maggie's Wigs 4 Kids, Kids Kicking Cancer and Ronald McDonald House Detroit. We promote the donation of gift cards for gas, food and small gifts for kids.

·How can I donate food, clothes, or other items?

Label all food with a brief description and the date. Bring the minimal amount of packaging to the fridge to avoid litter. Organize the fridge, freezer, or shelves when you drop off your items (it's much appreciated!).

·How can I donate money? Where does it go?

Venmo @detroit-communityfridge. Any amount helps! On any given day, your donation might go to buying food to cook meals, restocking our cleaning kits, or materials for a shelter at a new fridge location. Know that your donation makes a direct impact and is appreciated.

·How else can I help?

The fridges and the surrounding area require cleaning frequently. Grab some gloves, rags, cleaning solution, and trash bags and head to the closest fridge. All people deserve clean, fresh food with dignity; an hour of cleaning makes a world of difference.






